

A supper and evening session was also held with 70 in attendance to listen to a presentation by Dr. Theis as well as music by ladies from Our Savior Lutheran, Ephrata.

ADDITIONAL FUNDS PROVIDED FOR THE HAITI MISSION FIELD

The WA-AK District delegates at the June 2006 convention voted to fund the mission grant of *Gospel Proclamation in Haiti—Four-Wheel-Drive Vehicle* at \$5,000. The description of this grant from the convention manual read, "Reverend Daniel Paul lives and teaches at the Lutheran Seminary in Port-au-Prince in southern Haiti. He also serves the northwest section of Haiti. Bus travel takes a couple of days, and car travel can be dangerous. With a four-wheel-drive vehicle he will then be able to be more efficient with his time and resources as well as transport other people and materials." The grant of \$5,000 has been paid.

After learning at the District Board meeting in September that the original funding was not nearly enough to purchase a vehicle, the Board voted to grant an additional \$10,000 to this endeavor. Funds used came from an unused \$10,000 grant that had been returned to the District. This money has been sent to Reverend Paul in Haiti.

As Vice President of Gospel Outreach, I received a congenial letter from Reverend Paul this summer. He was very thankful for the initial grant amount. It was interesting to read his postscript, "In my district there is no mail delivery, no internet access, no fixed telephone, no electricity, no potable water." This is really touching to my heart. The grant from our WA-AK District was certainly valued and well placed.

The stateside contact for this mission is Pastor Wiseman in La Grande, Oregon. Pastor Wiseman knows Reverend Paul personally because they were classmates at the Seminary. He said of Reverend Paul, "He began this ministry from scratch. Before him, there was no Lutheran presence. He has purchased land and built the church. In his ministry, he is caring for 30-40 people. Reverend Paul works diligently to be a good steward of funds given."

The day I spoke to Pastor Wiseman, Reverend Paul was in Port-au-Prince doing the paper work to acquire children for an orphanage he is starting there as well.
