We have earned a total of \$17,709.00 for convention expenses with \$1,982.64 earned during 2012-2014. Contests: In Recycle Rumble, from Jan. to April, we were paired with JFK Rehabilitation Center in NJ. As of April 26, the score was WA-AK 596 to JFK 104. The winner receives 25% more on the qualified units sent in. District contest: S. Columbia Zone's recycling efforts won them the gift card and gift basket for earning the most per society - \$11.90. Congratulations!

From 2003 to March 2014, out of 418 WA organizations we are Number 1 in two categories: units sent in and qualified units. We are also number 1 of 1,590 "Other organizations" in category total qualifying units!! Keep up the good work.



Gospel Outreach

I hope you are all enjoying a beautiful spring with God's creation blooming forth. It is very interesting to look for God's

"signature" on all that He's made...even the food that He provides for us. Take note of some of these signatures. A sliced carrot looks like an eye. It is helpful for eyes. A walnut looks like a brain, and helps to support brain health and function. Celery reminds us of bones and contains 23% sodium just like our bones. Sodium is pulled from our bones if we don't get enough, so eat your celery. Tomatoes are excellent for our hearts, are usually red and have four chambers like our heart. A sliced onion looks like our cells and help to remove waste material from our cells. We know what an Awesome God we have, but there are many who haven't quite realized that.



What a marvelous outreach opportunity to share these signs with others. Genesis 1:29. "Then God said, "I give you every seed-bearing plant on the face of the whole earth and every tree that has fruit with seed in it. They will be yours for food...I give every green plant for food."
