How does Shared Support help feed the children?




unger was on every child's mind before Trinity HOPE began to provide a noon meal at school. The children were too hungry to learn and couldn't concentrate on their school work.

ne school and 42 children in 1999 started this ministry that has changed thousands of young people in Haiti. Today in 2025, over 62,000 children are fed in over 281 Christian schools throughout Haiti.

artnering with the schools through Shared Support allows Trinity HOPE to feed more children. Trinity HOPE does not want Haiti to be dependent on us. Shared Support is a way the school can responsibly invest in helping feed their students a daily nutritious meal.

ternal gratefulness is sent through the 35 Haitian Feeding Program
Directors. "We never stop giving thanks to Trinity HOPE and God for the
food He gives us because the food plays a big function in the school day. The
food is a blessing from God for us."





Trinity HOPE pays the vast amount of the program cost, but the school must also pay a small amount. Currently, most schools pay approximately 5% of the cost. This provides the opportunity for the school and parents to participate in the responsibility of feeding the children.

Each school is also required to have a paid cook to prepare the food daily. As a second part of Shared Support, once a school exceeds 75 meals per day, the school is required to pay their cook's salary.

We consider the food as a blessing from God. Most of the time the students come to school without eating anything at home, but they hope to find a hot meal at school.

HOW IS THE AMOUNT DETERMINED?

The percentage of Shared Support is determined when the school applies for the feeding program and is decided based on the number of students, the school's structure, and their ability to pay All money received through Shared Support is used to expand new feeding programs in additional schools.
